

Courage to Do What's Right

St. Boniface travelled through dangerous lands to bring the Gospel to people who did not know Christ.

Confirmation strengthens us with the Holy Spirit so we can stand for what is right — even when it's difficult.

Main Activity — “Doing What's Right, Even When It's Hard”

One reflection box with two short prompts:

Write one situation where doing the right thing feels difficult (peer pressure, fear of judgment, temptation, dishonesty, going along with the crowd).

(1–2 sentences)

Write how the Holy Spirit can give you courage in that moment.

(1–2 sentences.)

This focuses on moral courage — a core part of Confirmation.

Mini-Reflection (one line)

Complete the sentence:

“I need courage to do what's right when _____.”

“Holy Spirit, give me the courage to do what is right.

Help me follow Your truth with strength and faith.
