

Courage to Do What Is Right

St. Turibius saw injustice everywhere — corruption, abuse, unfair treatment of the poor — and he refused to ignore it. He teaches us that justice begins with one courageous person who chooses to do what is right. Confirmation strengthens us to confront wrongdoing with wisdom, truth, and courage.

Main Activity — “A Situation Where I Need Courage”

One reflection box with two short prompts:

Write about one situation where doing what is right takes courage (telling the truth, defending someone, refusing to join in gossip, choosing honesty, resisting peer pressure, apologising, reporting wrongdoing).
